




## Glossary

- Ambassador** (2 Cor 5:20) An authorized representative or messenger.
- Babel** Confusion or mixture.
- Dispensation** (Eph 3:2) A particular revelation of the will of God.
- Faith** (Heb 11:1,6) Confidence in the absolute truthfulness of every statement which comes from God
- Fear** (Deut 10:12) Fright, to be afraid. Reverential regard for, as to fear God.
- Grace** (Eph 2:8-9) The unmerited favor of God. When we get something that we don't deserve.  
**God's Riches At Christ's Expense**
- Mediator** (1Tim 2:5) One who intercedes to settle differences between people.
- Millennium** 1,000 years.
- Mystery** (Eph 3:1-9) Something which could not be known or understood until it is revealed.  
A secret hidden from the world until the appointed time.  
An expression used by the Apostle Paul to refer to the Age of Grace.
- Offering** Something presented in worship to God.
- Patriarch** The father or ruler of a family or tribe.
- Plague** An affliction sent by God as a punishment for sin.
- Promise** An engagement to do or not to do something.
- Prophet** (Isaiah 6:8) An authoritative messenger from God who communicated to the people His Word. The prophets message may be "forth-telling" (for that people & time) and / or "foretelling" (pertaining to people in a future time).
- Rapture** (1 Thes 4:13-18) State of being carried away with great joy. Reference to a time when the believer will be caught away to meet Christ in the air. The event that will mark the end of the Age of Grace.
- Repent** (Rev. 16:9-11) A turning around; a change of direction. To change one's ways. To deeply regret.
- Tribulation** (Matt 24:21) Great misery or distress from oppression.

**A Mountain Shadows Promise Road**

Law Exodus 19:3-8**

Exodus 15:22 “Then Moses led Israel from the Red Sea, and they went out into the wilderness of Shur; and they went three days into the wilderness ...” Exodus 12:7 tells us there were 600,000 men. Counting the women and children there must have been about 3 million people in total. If they were to become a nation, they would need to know how to govern justly and live together peacefully. So, now God is going to test them to see if they are ready.

During the years which followed there were 18 wicked kings which followed in the steps of Jeroboam. There were 18 kings and 1 queen which followed Rehoboam. Eight of the kings of Judah could be called good, but they could not undo all of the evil of the wicked ones. The wicked kings led the people into idolatry and other acts of disobedience against God. You cannot continue to sin against God without Him bringing judgment. God raised up the prophets to tell of the coming judgment, and finally it came. To sum it all up, we look back to Confusion Corners where God gave up the human race, called Abraham, and made him promises concerning a nation and a Savior. Jesus Christ came as the Savior and the Promised King to establish the Kingdom. But the Israelites rejected the Savior and the offer of the Kingdom. Because of this God did something different and new from what He had revealed as His plan. When Stephen was being stoned there was a man standing by who has holding the garments of those who were throwing the stones. His name was Saul, a brilliant young Jew who had been a student of the best teachers of the day. He was fearless, honest and lived his life adhering very closely to the Law given to Moses because he thought this would please God and result in his salvation. Today we're going to look at Saul's life from the day Stephen was stoned and to see how God chose to work through his life and bring about a radical change, just like the plan He was beginning to reveal

Therefore we come to the book of Revelation to see how God deals with Israel and all the others who are left behind in order to draw them to the Savior and King.


